


IMPORTANT NOTICE

2019 Education Property Tax Credit Changes

Manitoba Budget 2018 announced that, effective for the 2019 tax year, the calculation of the Manitoba Education Property Tax Credit (EPTC) will be based on school taxes and the \$250 deductible before the EPTC applies will be eliminated. This change may result in an increase in your property taxes. The following is an example of a **2018** tax notice, to demonstrate how the new EPTC rules will effect your taxes. There is no longer a credit on municipal taxes therefore, in this example, \$134.54 would not be reduced from the amount owing. This tax notice amount owing would be \$1,312.96.

2019 Gravel Tenders

Gravel Supply

Tenders will be accepted by the undersigned for the supply of Gravel for Townships 16, 17 and 18 in Range 23 and 24 (former Municipality of Shoal Lake). Tenders to indicate crushed or screened and cost per cubic yard delivered to each township. Price to include pit charges and any other related costs. Required gravel specifications are available by contacting the municipal manager of operations.

Gravel Crushing Tender

Tenders will be accepted for crushing of no less than 30,000 yards of gravel in the Municipal Pit located on SE 30-17-21 WPM. Specific location of crushing is determined by the municipality

Gravel Hauling Tender

Tenders will be accepted for the 2019 gravel hauling project. (1) Loading and hauling from stockpile (2) hauling from crusher. Approximately 30,000 yards of gravel to be deposited on Municipal roads in Townships 16, 17 and 18 in Ranges 22 and 21 (formerly RM of Strathclair).

Tenders must show price per yard mile from the Municipal pit located on SE 30-17-21wpm and can be submitted as follows:

1) Price per yard/mile to load and haul from stockpile or haul from crusher. Gravelling for the whole Municipality; and/or

2) Price per yard/mile to load and haul from stockpile or haul from crusher, by individual township.

Gravelling to be completed no later than August 1st, 2019. Late gravel applications could effect your ability submit on future tenders.

Tenders may be submitted on a one or two year contract. Please specify.

Lowest or any tender not necessarily accepted. Sealed tenders marked "Gravel Tender" to be submitted by April 1st, 2019 at 5:00 p.m.
